

Each year, every library in Vermont is required to submit a lengthy, detailed report to the Department of Libraries, which covers all kinds of statistics, activities, and library-related information from the preceding year (in our case, fiscal year 2020-21). It's definitely been a challenging time in the age of Covid, and although we've had to limit our programming, we've also managed to stay open and allow our patrons access to wifi, computers, and of course all sorts of books, dvds, and other materials to check out. I thought it might be interesting to share a few of the statistics from the report, which may give you a little insight into our little library!--Josh Worman, Director, Haston Library

Some numbers from July 1st, 2020-June 30th, 2021:

Patron visits: 2,274

Circulation (items scanned): 3,882


SPOTLIGHT On: THE ABLE LIBRARY



One of the many wonderful things that the Vermont Department of Libraries offers is the ABLE Library. ABLE stands for Audio, Braille, Large Print, and Electronic books, which is what they offer to any Vermonter who might have a visual impairment or a learning disability. The Haston is also very fortunate to receive a quarterly shipment of large print books from ABLE, which augments our already sizable large print collection. Every three months, we send back the ones we've gotten from them in the preceding shipment, then a few days later, we receive a new batch of books, usually around twenty-five altogether.
