

SEPTEMBER IS LIBRARY CARD SIGN-UP MONTH!




Since 1987, <u>Library Card Sign-up Month</u> has been held each September to mark the beginning of the school year. During the month, the American Library Association and libraries unite in a national effort to ensure every child signs up for their own library card. The effort started in 1987 as a response to then-Secretary of Education William Bennett, who stated, "Let's have a campaign ... Every child should obtain a library card and use it." So come on down to the Haston and sign yourself and/or your child up for a library card, and start exploring everything that libraries have to offer!

CHANGES COMING TO KANOPY

If you're a user of Kanopy, the library's streaming service, there's something new that's coming up on the horizon. As of November 1st, Kanopy will be changing their system from play credits to a new ticket system, so rather than receiving credits, each patron will receive a set number of tickets per month. This works out to 12 tickets per user per month for the Haston. Anything that's two hours or less, for example, will require two tickets. (Kanopy Kids content will continue to be its own section on Kanopy and will not be included in the ticket system).
