
FRANKLIN COMMUNITY VOICES


library work experience as well as experience working with children. They must have excellent communication skills and good computer skills.

AN ECLIPSE, AND A LOSS

In Memoriam: Eugenia "Nini" Worman by Library Director Josh Worman





The library co-hosted an eclipse event with Franklin Rec on Monday, April 8th, but sadly, I was unable to attend. My mother, Eugenia "Nini" Worman, had been in declining health for a few weeks, and she eventually entered hospice care at the family home on Middle Road. My two brothers, one of my sisters, her husband, and I all witnessed totality together on the front lawn (and of course, we were all blown away by the whole thing). We then spent the rest of the afternoon at my mom's bedside. I was holding her hand as she slipped away at around 6:15 that evening.

Nini was a teacher, a great writer, and a lover of books, libraries, music, movies, gardening, swimming, and running (always with my dad, of course). She raised five children on limited means, and eventually went back to school and earned a Masters in Special Education. She taught at Franklin, Fairfield, and Sheldon, and her career spanned more than twenty years. She had a mischievous sense of humor, and a soft spot for any

child in need. Nini served as a trustee of the Haston Library at two different times, in the late 1960s and again in the early 2000s. Her signature is on the wall here at the library, in a framed tribute to another trustee.

Michelle and I (and Ollie) and my four siblings miss her terribly. The house has never felt so empty.

There will be a memorial service for Nini at Grace Episcopal Church in Sheldon, VT on Saturday, June 1st, 2024 at 3:00 PM, with a reception to follow at The Abbey. Donations in her memory may be sent to the Haston Library and/or Grace Episcopal Church.
